### Ballot Instructions for Prioritizing Policy Option Analysis

- When you receive your ballot, please enter your selections for the top 10 priority options for analysis. The rows of the ballot table will correspond to options from the catalog of policy options. For a description of the policy options, please review the "Catalog of State Actions" and the "Brief Description of Catalog of State Actions" document links available at [www.akclimatechange.us](http://www.akclimatechange.us).
- Place an "X" in the box for the top 10 options that you feel deserve priority due to their GHG reduction potential, cost effectiveness, feasibility (both technical and political), and important ancillary issues (e.g. co-benefits, such as reduction of other pollutants or job creation).
- Do not place more than one "X" on any individual option.
- If you feel that individual options should be combined, you may place "X's" on "bundles" of options. Describe your bundling preference in the Comments column.  
  
For example, if you wish to select a bundled option that combines options 2.1 and 2.2, place an "X" in row 2.1 and write "bundle with 2.2", then place an "X" in row 2.2 and write "bundle with 2.1". This would count as one of your 10 selections.
- The 10 options selected by the most ESD members will be designated high priority for initial analysis.
- The second 10 options will be given medium priority.
- The remaining options will be designated low priority'
